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Lesson Plan: Introduction to Basic Algebra

Objective: By the end of this lesson, students will be able to understand and solve basic algebraic equations.

Duration: 60 minutes

Materials Needed:

- Whiteboard or blackboard
- Markers or chalk
- Worksheets with algebraic equations
- Calculators (optional)

Procedure:

1. Warm-up (5 minutes):

- Assign homework exercises related to the lesson's topics.
